

We act along with Messrs. Munroe and Associates for David Shane Gibson.

On the 22nd January A.D., 2018, we wrote to Mr. Garvin Gaskin, DPP requesting discovery of the following items to assist with the preparation of our client's defence in the upcoming criminal proceedings:-

All handwritten Statements provided by Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian.

- 2. Every written, recorded, and/or oral statement of Mr. Gibson made, in the course of the alleged criminal investigation, to a public servant engaged in law enforcement activity or to any person(s) then acting under the direction of our client or in cooperation with him AND approximately when Mr. Gibson is alleged to have made each statement and where he was when each alleged statement was made.
- 3. Any video recording (DVD)(s) and or any other electronic recording of the taking of the oral Statements of Mr. Jonathan Ash, Ms. Deborah Bastian, Mr. Gregory Butler, Mr. Jack Thompson, Ms. Mary Mitchell, Ms. Denisia Aranha, Ms. Branson Gibson relating to the criminal action or proceedings pending against Mr. Gibson.
- All bank account information in relation to Mr. Jonathan Ash from the year 2014 to July 2017.
- 5. Every photograph and/or drawing relating to the alleged criminal action or proceeding which was made or completed by a public servant engaged in law enforcement activity or which was made by anyone in respect to these proceedings including but not limited to photographs, diagrams, sketches, memo book entries.
- 6. Information pertaining to any or all property alleged to have been obtained from or attributed to Mr. Gibson.
- 7. Every tape and other electronic recording in the possession of the prosecution, irrespective of whether such recording was made during the course of the alleged criminal transaction and investigation, including but not limited to all tapes of radio transmissions, tapes of telephone calls, and videotapes, if any, as well as any BTC and ALIV printout and precinct telephone switchboard record or telephone log entries.
- The approximate date, time, and place of each offence alleged to have been committed by Mr.
 Gibson.

Anything required to be disclosed, prior to trial, to the accused by the prosecutor, including but not limited to all property, evidence, information, or leads to information, which are exculpatory or which could reasonably be expected to weaken or affect any evidence proposed to be introduced against the accused or which would in any manner aid the accused in the preparation of an adequate and proper defence or which are otherwise favourable to the accused or which may lead to exculpatory or arguably exculpatory property, evidence, or leads, regardless of any statute, rule, or regulation otherwise governing the time of disclosure of such items and (2), on a continuing basis, regardless of whether admissible at trial or not.
- 10. The Curriculum Vitae of any and all experts the crown intends to call during trial as well as a written summary of the expert testimony that the crown intends to rely on. Unless you advise otherwise by 22nd February A.D., 2018, we will assume that no expert testimony will be introduced at trial. We will rely on this information in preparation for trial.
- 11. All deals, arrangements, benefits or promises of benefit, to procure cooperation or evidence for the Crown in connection with this case inclusive of any immunity agreements or promise of immunity offered to Mr. Ash or Ms. Bastian.
- The Police Case Diary in relation to the investigation of our client.

By letter dated the 10th May A.D., 2018 your office provided the following: -

- "The DVD'S which are referred to in the statement of Sgt. 1492 Strachan";
- "The report and CD'S of the Record of Interview was downloaded by Sgt. 1492 Dale Strachan";
- "The further material referred to in the statement of Insp. Dames";
- 4. "The spreadsheet referred to in the statement of Jack Thompson";
- 5. "The analysis and accompanying referred to in the statement of Mary Mitchell";

Further, you also gave Notice of the following additional evidence the Crown intends to produce:-

- 1. "Ms. Audrey Dames together with cheques and bank statements from Mr. Ash's account #3003715 at Commonwealth Bank";
- 2. "Report of Philip de Nahlik BSc ACA, who the Crown proposes to give expert evidence".

The disclosure provided under cover of your letter dated 10th May A.D., 2018 was very limited in scope and did not satisfy your obligation to provide the full or proper discovery necessary to allow our client properly to prepare his defence. In the circumstances, it is imperative that we reiterate our request for the each of the previously requested items which were not provided or addressed in your correspondence. If the outstanding items do not exist, we request your formal confirmation of same.

For your ease of reference, the following items remain outstanding:

1. All handwritten Statements provided by Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian.

OUR NOTE: Mr. Archer informed us that written manuscripts do not exist. Our view on this matter has already been expressed in previous correspondence. Please confirm in writing whether written manuscripts for Mr. Johnathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian exist or not. Further, we simply cannot believe the suggestion that we have had full disclosure of all statements provided by Mr. Johnathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian and notes all of all interviews conducted with them. We ask to be provided with a Written Statement or Affidavit from the Corruption Unit, stating that a search has been made for all such statements and materials and those provided dated the 28th June A.D. 2017 (Ash) and 25th July A.D., 2017 (Bastian) are their only statements.

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2. Any video recording (DVD)(s) and or any other electronic recording of the taking of the Statements of Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian.

<u>DUR NOTE</u>: To date, we have only been provided with a DVD recording of Mr. D. Shane Gibson giving his oral statement to the investigating officers.

All deals, arrangements, benefits or promises of benefit, to procure cooperation
or evidence for the Crown in connection with this case inclusive of any immunity
agreements or promise of immunity offered to Mr. Jonathan Ash, Ms. Bastian or
Jack Thompson.

<u>OUR NOTE</u>: Mr. James Guthrie QC indicated verbally at our last appearance before the Acting Chief Justice Isaacs that the immunity agreements were being settled and that copies would be provided.

4. The Police Case Diary in relation to the investigation of our client.

OUR NOTE: To date, we have not been provided with any information contained in the police case diary. For the avoidance of doubt, we note in D/ASP Thompson statement dated 16th August A.D., 2017 the following declaration: "On Sunday 25th June A.D., 2017, I saw and spoke to Mr. Anthony Ferguson, Deputy Commissioner, who handed over to a criminal investigation file, and he instructed me to commence investigation into this matter concerning an alleged Bribery in relation to a complaint made by Jonathan Ash". We hereby request the referenced criminal investigation file along with the complete case diary which are plainly relevant to our client's case.

5. All bank account information of Mr. Jonathan Ash or his affiliated businesses and or companies, viz. Ash Enterprises, Ash Enterprises & Trucking Services and High Rollers Enterprises Ltd. We would ask to be provided with all of the bank records referred to in the Witness Statement of the proposed expert witness including the records that the witness did not examine on instructions. We would also ask for confirmation that the records indicated above constitute <u>all</u> of the accounts of Mr. Ash, his entities and Mrs. Ash.

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OUR NOTE: To date, we have only been provided banking details for Mr. Ash concerning Account # 3003715 at Commonwealth Bank.

On a further review of this matter, we have concluded that the production of additional documents and materials (not previously requested) are required in furtherance of your duties for full or proper disclosure. We therefore request that you forthwith provide following items; or alternatively that you confirm that the said items do not exist:-

- a. Copies all of Supreme Court documents or documents of the Financial Intelligence Unit relating to any injunction or freezing orders with respect to Mr. Jonathan Ash, his above listed companies and also the banking accounts his immediate family members;
- Copies all of Supreme Court documents or documents of the Financial Intelligence
 Unit relating to any injunction or freezing orders with respect Ms. Deborah Bastian
 and her immediate family members;
- c. Copies of all antecedents/convictions of Mr. Jonathan Ash. Also, information as to whether, at the date of the arraignment of our client, there was any pending criminal charges against either Mr. Jonathan Ash or Ms. Deborah Bastian;
- d. Access to the cell phones of Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian in order to have our own expert do any independent assessment on the contents of the same;
- e. Copies of all electronic communications between Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms.
 Deborah Bastian including but not limited to WhatsApp messages, text messages and emails;
- f. Copies of all infractions committed by Mr. Jonathan Ash and his various companies with any government agency including but not limited to the Customs Department;

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g. Copies of any reports generated by or from any listening device or photographs, or

videotape in relation to this matter;

h. Confirmation of <u>all</u> dates and times when Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah

Bastian met with the investigating officers in this matter;

i. All phone records, billings and statements of Mr. Jonathan Ash, Ms. Deborah Bastian

and Mr. David Shane Gibson;

j. Copies of all correspondence on the public files related to the work of the National

Recovery and Reconstruction Unit(NRRU). In particular we request copies of all

minutes kept by Mr. Jack Thompson at meetings held in relation to the Hurricane

cleanup by NEMA following Hurricane Matthew which involved or referenced our

client in any way, all emails passing between the NRRU, any of it's agents and any

other Government agency or contractor. Additionally, we request copies of all

records of NEMA related to the Spreadsheet (referred to in the Statement of Jack

Thompson) together with all related documents and emails.

Further, we request confirmation that the only Oral Statement that exists and the Crown

intends to rely on by Mr. David Shane Gibson is his Oral Statement given on the 2nd August A.D.,

2017.

We look forward to hearing from before the scheduled trial date of the 11th June A.D., 2018.

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

R v. David Shane Gibson - VBI No. 233/10/2017

We are writing in response to the matters raised in your letter of 31st May, 2018.

First, we note the reference to 'outstanding items' on page 4 of your letter. We are able to deal with these as follows.

1. Your request for 'All handwritten Statements provided by Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian.'

Mr. Ash did not make or sign any handwritten statement. We have supplied you with a copy of his typewritten statement, signed and dated 28th June, 2017.

Ms. Bastian was a suspect in this matter, and we now enclose:

- (i) A record of her interview under caution dated 1st July 2017, handwritten and typed, which she did not sign.
- (ii) Her handwritten and typed statement under caution dated 4th July 2017.
- (iii) Her handwritten and typed witness statement dated 19th July 2017.
- (iv) Her handwritten and typed witness statement dated 25th July 2017.
- (v) The receipt she signed for the return of her Samsung telephone dated 4th August 2017.

2. We note you request for a 'Written Statement or Affidavit from the Corruption Unit'.

This request is both unnecessary and unjustified. We repeat that we are aware of our obligations as to disclosure. We are satisfied these have now been fully complied with.

3. Your request for 'Any video recording (DVD) (s) and or any other electronic recording of the taking of the Statements of Mr. Jonathan Ash and Ms. Deborah Bastian.'

There is no electronic record with regard to Mr. Ash. There is an electronic record (i) of Ms. Bastian's interview under caution dated 1st July, 2017 and (ii) of her statement under caution dated 4th July, 2017. (For your information these were recorded because at that time she was treated as a suspect). The CD of the statement under caution dated 4th July, 2017 is enclosed.

4. Your request with regard to 'All deals, arrangements, benefits or promises of benefit, to procure cooperation or evidence for the Crown in connection with this case inclusive of any immunity agreements or promise of immunity offered to Mr. Jonathan Ash, Ms. Bastian or Jack Thompson.'

A summary of the immunity agreement signed by Mr. Ash is enclosed. Ms. Bastian was offered an immunity agreement, a summary of this is also enclosed. No immunity agreement exists with, or has been offered to, Mr. Thompson.

5. Your request for 'The Police Case Diary in relation to the investigation of our client.'

The case diary is an internal administrative record which is not disclosable: it does not contain material on which the Crown either relies or which it is required to disclose because it may be of benefit to the defence. For your information the *'criminal investigation file'* referred to in ASP Thompson's statement dated 16th August 2017 contained a blank police diary and incident form.

We have enclosed a statement from Sgt. 1877 Donald Rolle which outlines the inquiries that Ms. Bastian conducted with the police.

6. Your request for 'All bank account information in relation to Jonathan Ash ...' etc.

We have supplied you with the information attached to the expert's report prepared by Mr. de Nahlik and disclosed on 10th May, 2018. We consider that you are also entitled to see the further material referred to in that report and this is now enclosed.
